Forum Purpose (s):

Overarching Purpose: The FORUM is intended to provide an annual process for information sharing and discussion on Fraser salmon fisheries issues between DFO and First Nations (Tier 2) and First Nations with other First Nations (Tier 1). First Nation attendees have the opportunity to provide their advice and recommendations on management plans.

February FORUM Purpose: The intent of this meeting is provide an overview of the contents of the draft 2018/2019 IFMP for southern BC salmon and to initiate thinking about fishery planning for 2018.

This presentation will provide the 2018 sockeye forecast. This presentation may provide some contextual information related to environmental conditions and biological information related to the 2018 adult returns (i.e. 2013 adult escapements, 2014 lake rearing, 2015 smolt outmigration and ocean entry, up to the 2017 returns). The information is provided to improve our understanding of Fraser Sockeye population dynamics.

- **Fraser River Sockeye Spawning Initiative (FRSSI)** – Ann Marie Huang
This presentation will focus on the “why” and the “how” regarding the future of the Fraser Sockeye Spawning Initiative (FRSSI) discussed at the January 30-31, 2018 workshop. With a little bit of “what” thrown in to keep us grounded. Feedback is requested on the “how” (i.e., future FRSSI process) as well as the “who should participate”.

- **Proposed Sockeye Escapement Plans** – Jamie Scroggie

This presentation will include the draft escapement options outlined in the IFMP (fisheries reference points & LAERs) and the projected spawners to the grounds for each forecasted stock under each draft escapement option. The presentation will also include management adjustments used in conjunction with the escapement options which, at the time of the meeting, will be based on historical data and an overview of when year-specific estimates of management adjustments, timing estimates and diversion estimates will be available (i.e., typically for June FRP meeting).
